

## 2018–19 SEASON ADDENDUM

### Summer Concerts and Residencies

- **Annual Free Memorial Day Concert:** conducted by Jaap van Zweden, May 27, 2019
- **Concerts in the Parks, Presented by Didi and Oscar Schafer:** conducted by Jaap van Zweden, June 2019
- **Bravo! Vail:** July 2019

### Chamber Music

- **New York Philharmonic Ensembles at Merkin Concert Hall:** six Sunday matinee concerts, October 21, 2018; December 9, 2018; January 13, 2019; February 17, 2019; April 7, 2019; May 26, 2019
- **Saturday Matinee Concerts:** chamber music followed by orchestral works; three of the concerts are followed by a Q&A with Philharmonic musicians, and the other is followed by Philharmonic musicians performing original works by students in the Philharmonic’s Very Young Composers program; the 2018–19 Saturday Matinee Concerts take place October 27, 2018; November 24, 2018; February 23, 2019; April 27, 2019
- **Co-Presentations with 92nd Street Y:** Philharmonic musicians collaborating with guest artists, January 20, 2019; March 17, 2019

### Education

- **Young People’s Concerts (ages 6–12):** introducing young audiences to the orchestra through interactive concerts that feature repertoire of all periods; the 2018–19 series, titled *Music Across Borders*, takes place November 17, 2018; January 12, 2019; March 2, 2019; May 11, 2019
- **Young People’s Concerts for Schools (grades 3–12):** Young People’s Concerts adapted to classroom audiences, many of whom have been prepared by Philharmonic Teaching Artists through the Philharmonic Schools program, May 8–10, 2019
- **Very Young People’s Concerts (ages 3–6):** Philharmonic musicians introduce classical music through games, active listening, and hands-on music-making; the 2018–19 series, titled *Philharmonic Playground*, takes place February 24–25, 2019; March 31–April 1, 2019; June 2–3, 2019
- **Young People’s Concerts Play! (grades 3–6):** online learning platform making Young People’s Concerts available for on-demand streaming, enhanced by interactive lessons for classrooms
- **Philharmonic Schools (grades 3–5):** in-school program in which Philharmonic Teaching Artists teach students how to listen, perform, and compose
- **Very Young Composers program (grades 4–12):** students in New York and around the world learn to create their own music
- **Insights at the Atrium (adults):** free events at Lincoln Center’s David Rubenstein Atrium tied to season concerts and events
- **Philharmonic Academy, Jr. (pre-college):** Philharmonic musicians train pre-college students in partnership with institutions in New York that are committed to strong orchestra programs; current partners include the Harmony Program and Hoff-Barthelson Music School

## **Recordings, Broadcasts, and Social Media**

- **Decca Gold:** Universal Music Group's newly established US classical music label, which released a recording of Jaap van Zweden and the Philharmonic in Beethoven's Symphonies Nos. 5 and 7 on February 23, 2018; the relationship between a major label and a major orchestra will yield a series of Philharmonic performances that will be made available on CD and for streaming and download; Decca Gold will also take over the New York Philharmonic's catalogue of self-produced digital recordings released since 2008, expanding the reach of Philharmonic performances from the past decade; Decca Gold will release six additional recordings in the 2018–19 season featuring Jaap van Zweden and the Philharmonic
- **Facebook Live:** first orchestra to broadcast a full concert on Facebook Live, in September 2016; the Orchestra presented its fifth Facebook Live concert broadcast in February 2018
- ***The New York Philharmonic This Week:*** award-winning series syndicated nationally 52 weeks per year and available on nyphil.org, returning for its 15th season; with Radio Host Alec Baldwin
- **Social Media:** Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Tumblr, YouTube, Pinterest, SoundCloud, and blog (What's New)

## **The Archives**

- **New York Philharmonic Archives:** approximately six million pages dating to 1842, housed in the Samuel B. and David Rose Building at Lincoln Center
- **New York Philharmonic Leon Levy Digital Archives ([archives.nyphil.org](http://archives.nyphil.org)):** when completed, the online collection will contain every document in the New York Philharmonic Archives from 1842 through 1970 as well as all public documents from 1970 through today

## **Free and Low-Cost Tickets**

- **Philharmonic Free Fridays:** allotment of free tickets for 13- to 26-year-olds for each of the 2018–19 season's 24 Friday subscription concerts
- **MyPhil:** discounted subscription for young adults ages 17 through 35
- **Student Rush and Senior Tickets:** Student Rush Tickets are available for select concerts up to ten days before the concert; senior tickets are available for select concerts the day of the performance at the David Geffen Hall Box Office
- ***Phil the Hall:*** four performances for New York's community and service professionals, hosted by iconic New Yorkers and led by Jaap van Zweden at David Geffen Hall, April 4–6, 2019
